

Rubus species

PRE-TREATMENT – No pre-treatment is required.

SOWING – Use a good quality propagation mix and fill seedling trays, moisten and sprinkle seeds over the top and only just cover with washed river sand or propagation mix.

Gently mist spray making sure to avoid seed disturbance.

Place in a warm sunny area or in a greenhouse.

Seeds can be slow to germinate and can be erratic but once they start, they will grow quickly..

Ensure that the seeds stay warm, moist and don't dry out but do not waterlog soil.

Prick out when large enough to handle, and plant in the garden in a full sun position.

Raspberries have a tendency to spread so they are best contained within a garden bed, a raised bed is even better because they also have a suckering habit.

Keep maintained as required by regular pruning.
