Gompholobium species

Gompholobium scabrum G. hendersonii

Propagation

Scarify the seed or pre-soak it for 24 hours in warm water. Sow spring in a warm greenhouse at 20°C.

When they are large enough to handle, prick the seedlings out into individual pots and grow them on in the shadehouse for at least their first winter.

Plant them out into their permanent positions in late spring or early summer, after the last expected frosts. Give the plants some protection from the cold for at least its first winter outdoors.
